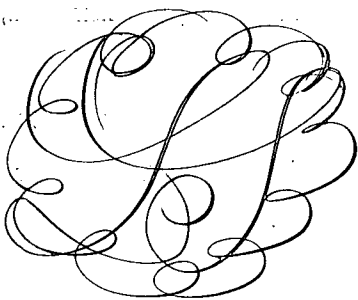

Carlisle, in his own right and as Guardian of said Thomas Carlisle, Newton Carlisle, and Mary Carlisle, and to his heirs, the East Half of the North West Quarter and the West Half of the North East Quarter of Section Twenty Four, in Township Seven North, of Range Twenty Six West in the District of Lands subject to sale at Augusta, Mississippi containing One Hundred and Sixty Two Acres according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned Warrant, in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said
