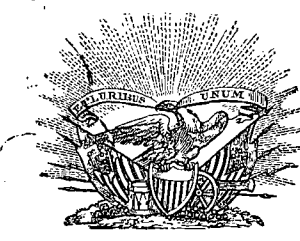

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 23th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 67,890 for *110* acres, issued in favor of

James Knapp, Ensign in Captain Andersons Company Michigan Volunteers Black Hawk War; and Private in Captain Mc Smalds Company, United States Army War of 1812.
