Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850,

entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 41,174 for 80 acres,

issued in favor of Rebecca Prescott, widow of Ephraim Prescott, Private Captain's Mess and Miller's Companies, South Carolina Militia, War 1812,

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the

West Half of the North East Quarter of Section Eight, in Township Six, of Range Nineteen, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Cahaba Alabama, containing Eighty Acres and Twenty five hundredths of an Acre, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: Which has been assigned to Harris Brannin.

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said
