Petition of Administrator

The petition of Mary Ann Newsom respectfully shows that William Newsom, late of said County, departed his life this 4th day of September 1862, leaving no will so far as your petitioner knows or believes. That said intestate did seized and possessed of a small, neat and personal estate, consisting of a tract of land lying on Pearl River in said County, Eighteen Negro slaves, young and old, a small flock of horses, cattle, hogs, sheep and goats, and some farming utensils, all of said personal estate being estimated to be worth not exceeding Twelve thousand dollars. That your petitioner is the widow of said intestate. That besides your petitioner your decedent left eight other heirs, and distributed to wit:

Lewis J. Newsom, Patsy A. Newsom, Sarah C. Newsom, John C. Newsom, Francis M. Newsom, Isaac N. Newsom, Mary C. Newsom, Emily N. Newsom, children of said decedent, all of whom are minors. That your petitioner believes that said estate should be immediately administered, for the proper management of said estate, and that by virtue of her right under the Statute, she therefore prays, that your honor will grant letters of administration to her in the premises, upon qualifying herself according to law, and the directions of this Court. Your petitioner has come to offer to the consideration of your honor, A. S. Buckley, Wm. Lee & Hugh Fortinberry & C. Prager as securities upon her bond, and to nominate B. B. Barnes, Bay. Bryant and B. W. Holloway as appraisers to value the goods and chattels, and personal estate of said intestate.

And is in duty bound your petitioner will ever pray & sworn to and subscribed before me in open Court this 6th day of January 1863.
