

# Mystery Farm Home No. Sixty-Six Located Three Miles South Of Hub

Doretha Abram wrote a letter to the newspapers identifying three mystery farm homes, one of which, Number 66, belongs to her father, Harrison Abram.

Harrison Abram and his family live about three miles south of Hub, on Columbia Route 5, Box 196. There are about twenty-five acres in the place at the house that are in cultivation.

Harrison says he likes to grown corn and sweet potatoes. This year

he has in about two acres of sweet potatoes.

Livestock on the farm consists of three head of cattle, a mule and a horse, plus a bunch of chickens. The mule and horse do the farm work.

Harrison married Coreen Jefferson on June 25, 1916. A couple of years later they built their house.

Abram stated that he has relied on information from the county agent and from Prof. T. J. Dillon

at Globe Academy for most of his information on farming. His land is fairly level lying, so he hasn't done much terracing.

Toxey Abram married Linnie Lee Benson. They live in the third house from Harrison. Their children are Josephine, Linda Faye

and Toxey, Jr.

Thomas married Ezralee Monday. Their home is next door. Children in this family are Patricia Ann, Anna Marie, Thomas, Jr., and Vallarie.

Gary married Hazel Rich. They live in Kansas City, Mo.

W. C. Abram married Tressie Mae Bender. Their child is W. C., Jr., and they live in Jackson.

Asylena married Ulyess Jones. They are at Pelahatchie, Miss., where they are raising chickens. Children are Robert J., E. J., and Linda Marie.

Alice Mae Abram lives at home. She graduated from Globe Academy past commencement. While in school she was a member of NHA and played basketball.

Doretha Abram will be a senior at Globe Academy when school opens. She says her hobby is reading. She has served as NHA secretary and as junior class secretary.
