There are 86 acres in the farm where the Mystery Farm Home is located. Eighty acres of this plot are in timber.

The old barn that shows in the picture is being torn down. There are three ponds on the place that provide fishing.

Mr. Stringer married Miss Velma Cook in February of 1938. They have two children, Emerson and June.

Emerson will be in the tenth grade next year. He is in the Columbia High School band, playing clarinet. He and June attended the Music Camp that was held at Mississippi Southern during the summer.

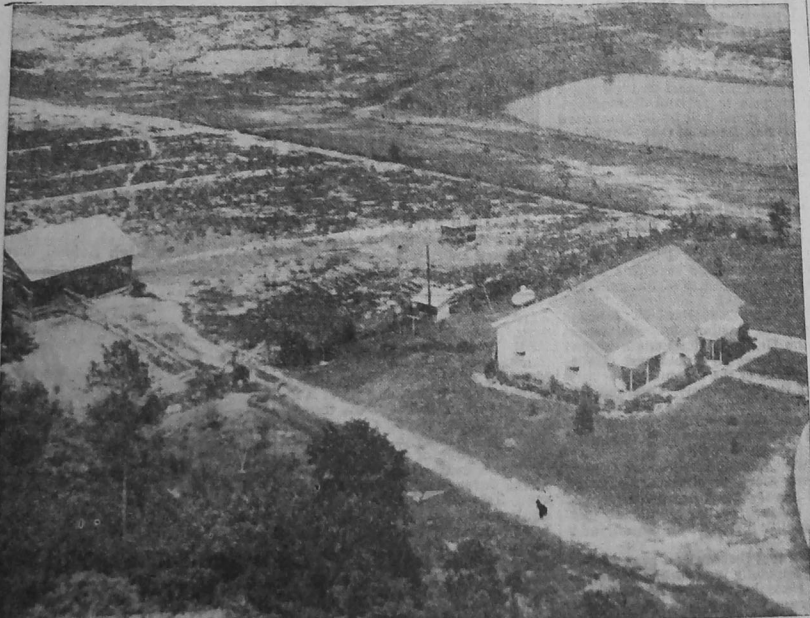
Emerson likes to hunt and fish. He is working at the auction barn during the summer.
